Our School Virtues

In the EYFS we focus on 5 virtues, helpfulness, confidence, kindness, determination and patience. We give out stickers to promote these virtues in the classroom. Each week we focus on a particular virtue and on a Friday we choose a child to take home the virtue teddy. This also forms part of our reward system and the class work as a team to fill our marble jar. Once the jar is full the children choose a class treat, which could be anything from a pyjama day to bringing in our bikes and scooters.






We encourage you to add observations of your child at home to enable us to share in their learning at home and at school. We will give you further information in September about how to

We are currently finalising our plans and will let you know which class your child will be in as soon as possible.



Rainbowfish class will use the door on the infant playground to enter and exit the building.

Angelfish class will use the door in the EYFS garden to enter and exit the building.

Doors will open at 8.45am, registration is at 8.55am.

EYFS children will finish school at 3.10pm.

(Please note this is 5 minutes earlier than the rest of the school.)

Nursery Sessions are 9am - 12 or 12-3.10pm

Or a full day from 9am -3.10pm

All Reception children are currently entitled to Universal free school meals. There will be a selection of hot and cold options to choose from.

Nursery Children are able to order a school meal for £2.34.

Water is always available in the classroom. We have fruit for a morning snack which is provided by the governments 'Fruit and Vegetable Scheme'.

Milk is also available for children under 5 with the school milk scheme.

We have four house teams: Cookworthy, Gibson, Methleigh, and Penrose.

If children have older brothers and sisters in school they will be in the same house team. For families new to the school you will be informed of your child's house team.









The PE kit is: school jumper, black shorts; plimsols or trainers and a t-shirt in the house team colour.

Children will come to school in their PE kit in on their PE day. We will confirm our PE day at a later date.

The nursery will begin by playing lots of games with rhymes, sounds, music and their voices. They will be learning to listen, and enjoying lots of stories and songs together.

The school teaches phonics using the Read, Write Inc scheme. There is a nursery element to this that will be introduced in the Summer term and we will give you further details when we're ready to start.

Nursery children will be introduced to Fred the Frog who helps children learn to blend. We play lots of games with Fred talk. This is when children hear the sounds c - a - t and can begin to identify the word cat.
