

### Foundation stage -

This week the children have been busy listening to the story "The Viking who was seasick."

We had a special visit from members of Helston town band they played the flora day tune many thanks to Mrs. Blight for organising this special treat.

Today we also had a visit from Mike Lacey the photographer he talked to the children about his job and allowed them to use one of his special cameras to take a photo of their friend riding on a surfboard. We have enjoyed the lovely weather and been outside building and making the most of the mud kitchen. In Forest Schools, we made ivy crowns and added wildflowers, daisies, dandelions, pink campions, and bluebells.

Please could we remind all children to need to bring in their library books so they can be changed on a regular

basis. Sharing these lovely stories is really important in developing a love of books and reading.

## Key Stage 1 Year 1 -

This week the children have loved learning more about toys from the past. They looked at toys that are played with from birth to 7 years old and how they have changed. In maths the children have been comparing numbers to 50 using different representations. Please support them to carry on practising their counting to 50 and writing the numbers. They really enjoyed putting their cutting skills to good use when making smoothies in DT. The children know how to safely use the claw grip and the bridge grip. We are carrying on writing the story of the Queen's hat in literacy and the children are trying really hard to spell their tricky words correctly. Remember we are on our school trip on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> May so please make sure you have logged onto parent pay to sort out the details for your child.

### Year 2-

In topic this week we have looked at a time line of toys the children could have played with from age 0 to age 6. Next week we are going to look at toys parents or grandparents may have played with. If you have an old toy your child could share with the class please bring it next week. Alternatively, you may be able to tell you child about toys that were popular when you were younger. Continuing the work on healthy eating the children made and enjoyed drinking a fruit smoothie in DT. In Science, we are looking at animals and their young. The children have begun to write their own story based on George and the Dragon and in maths we have now moved onto learning about 3D shapes. Please note, for safety reasons it is important that all ks1 children be dropped off at the correct school entrance for their class in the morning. If a child is late, please take them through reception where their lunch order can be recorded. Thank you.

# <u>Key Stage 2</u> Year 3/4 -

The children had another action-packed week! There have been workshops In cricket, as well as staring our new PE lessons based around athletics. We have now completed our fractions and are moving into time. If your child owns a watch, it would be great if they could wear it to school so that we can start putting into practice what we are learning. Our geography topic is Local Environment and next week, Narwhals will be taking a trip in and around the local area on Monday 9th May, looking at the features of roads and spaces. We are currently looking at the history of the school as part of our local area and would love it if there is anyone who would like to come and talk to the children about attending school here themselves. ## Year 5/6 -

This week the children took part in a cricket workshop ran by Cornwall Cricket. Details of Cornwall Cricket clubs starting in May are overleaf. Children have started working on a biography of Margaret Thatcher. In geography, Herons class have been looking at the effects of climate change on Greenland and the differing views on if this is a good or bad thing. In science, Kestrels have been learning about the circulatory system.

Year 6 have SATs next week and we have continued to prepare for them. A reminder that Year 6 children are invited in for SATs breakfast at 8:30am each morning next week. They should come to the junior hall entrance by the school reception. If they are not coming for breakfast the children need to be here by no later that 8:55am each morning.


